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## To the participants of the 23<sup>rd</sup> World Congress of Philosophy

In a world in which, it is often said these days, a sense of civility and mutual respect is sadly lacking, this World Congress of Philosophy in Athens should serve as a counter-instance. That, at least, is my hope as I join with Konstantinos Boudouris and our other colleagues in welcoming all of the participants and their accompanying partners, family members, and friends. The general mood should be celebratory: celebratory of each other, celebratory of the site of some of the most outstanding and seminal achievements in the history of human thought, and celebratory of the love of wisdom that is what we call philosophy. The Congress theme, "Philosophy as Inquiry and Way of Life," encompasses very well all of these objects of celebration.

Modern World Congresses have been held once every five years, with some shorter intervals and also two gaps due to the world wars, since the year 1900, and so this one is the twenty-third. Despite the dark clouds, above all of an economic nature but influencing life as a whole, that overhung its preparation, participants in it will be among the most numerous ever to attend this event, basking, as I hope, in the rays of that "*έκυονος τοῦ ἄγαθοῦ*," as Plato's Socrates expressed it, the (summer) sun, offspring of the good.

The greatest good of a World Congress of Philosophy, as it seems to me, is the window that it offers on the whole world of thought, including the culturally diverse approaches to that world, which take on a new reality, a full life, when embodied in the persons of actual philosophers who come from all corners of the globe. There is a sense of community that is not reducible to the kind of experience afforded by simple tourism – as important as that element is for everyone who comes to Athens from elsewhere. It is, to put it somewhat abstractly but, I think, meaningfully, the sense of a "global 'we'."

And to the extent to which this is an accurate account of the atmosphere that we shall be sharing during the days of this Congress, one implication is that it should also be possible for us not only to benefit from philosophy as "consolation," as something directed inward, but also to extend its benefits outward to our fellow human beings, who are constantly being induced, by very powerful forces in our contemporary world, to think of life in the shallowest, most superficial ways. May our days here in Athens result, then, among other things, in a renewed belief in what the name of a very old academic society in my country asserts: "*ἡ φιλοσοφία τοῦ βίου κυβερνήτης*" – philosophy the guide of life.

My heartfelt thanks to all those involved in the hard work of preparing and organizing this World Congress, and to each and every one of you for participating.

## A tous les participants du XXIII<sup>e</sup> Congrès mondial de philosophie

Dans un monde où, comme on dit souvent aujourd' hui, la civilité et le respect mutuel font cruellement défaut, le Congrès Mondial de Philosophie à Athènes devrait servir comme un exemple contraire. C' est du moins avec cet espoir que je rejoins Konstantinos Boudouris et nos autres collègues pour souhaiter la bienvenue à tous les participants et à leurs partenaires, aux membres de leurs familles et aux amis qui les accompagnent. L' atmosphère dominante devrait être celle d'une célébration: célébration mutuelle de chacun, célébration du site où ont eu lieu quelques-uns des accomplissements les plus élevés et fondamentaux dans l' histoire de la pensée humaine, et célébration de l' amour de cette sagesse que nous appelons la philosophie. Le thème du Congrès, «La Philosophie comme Questionnement et Mode de Vie», recouvre à merveille ces différents objets de célébration.

Les Congrès Mondiaux modernes ont eu lieu tous les cinq ans depuis 1900, avec quelques intervalles plus brefs et deux interruptions plus étendues à cause des guerres mondiales. Celui-ci est donc le vingt-troisième de la série. Malgré les nuages noirs, surtout de nature économique mais tels à avoir des conséquences pour la vie entière, qui ont couvert le ciel pendant sa préparation, les participants à ce congrès seront parmi les plus nombreux à assister à cette sorte d'événement. Ils jouiront, j'espère, des rayons de ce « ἔκγονος τοῦ ἀγαθοῦ », comme l'a exprimé le Socrate de Platon, le soleil (d'élé) , enfant du Bien.

Le plus grand bien d' un Congrès Mondial de Philosophie, me semble-t-il, consiste à ouvrir une fenêtre donnant sur le monde entier de la pensée. Cela inclut toute une diversité d' approches culturelles, qui acquièrent une réalité nouvelle, une vie à part entière, quand elles s' incarnent dans les philosophes réels qui viennent de tous les coins de la terre. Il y a un sentiment de communauté qui ne se réduit pas à cette sorte d' expérience que nous donne le tourisme comme tel – aussi importante que soit cette expérience pour chacun se rendant à Athènes. Il s' agit, pour l' exprimer de manière abstraite mais qui, je crois, porte un sens, du sentiment d' un « nous » global.

Dans la mesure où ceci décrit avec vérité l' atmosphère que nous allons partager pendant les jours de ce Congrès, une conclusion qu' on peut tirer est la suivante : à savoir, que non seulement nous devrions pouvoir profiter de la philosophie comme « consolation », comme quelque chose qui se dirige vers l' intérieur, mais aussi répandre ses bienfaits vers l' extérieur, envers les autres êtres humains, qui subissent constamment, sous l' influence de forces très puissantes dans le monde contemporain, la tentation de regarder la vie de la manière la plus superficielle. Que le résultat de nos jours ici à Athènes soit, entre autres choses, une foi renouvelée en ce qu' une vieille société académique de mon pays a choisi comme son nom: «ἡ φιλοσοφία τοῦ βίου κυβερνήτης» – la philosophie comme guide de la vie.

Mes plus vifs remerciements à tous ceux qui se sont occupés du travail dur de préparer et d'organiser ce Congrès Mondial, et à vous tous pour votre participation.

## An die Teilnehmer des XXIII Philosophie-Weltkongresses

In einer Welt, die – wie heute oft mit Bedauern festgestellt wird – den Sinn für zivile Formen und wechselseitigen Respekt zunehmend vermissen lässt, soll dieser Weltkongress für Philosophie in Athen ein Gegenbeispiel darstellen. Das ist jedenfalls meine Hoffnung, wenn ich gemeinsam mit Konstantinos Boudouris und unseren anderen Kolleginnen und Kollegen alle, die an diesem Kongress teilnehmen, sowie deren Begleitpersonen, Familienmitglieder und Freunde begrüße. Die allgemeine Stimmung sollte die einer Feier sein: freuen wir uns über einander, über diesen Ort, an dem so ausgezeichnete und für die Geschichte des menschlichen Denkens so fruchtbare Leistungen erzielt worden sind, und freuen wir uns über die Liebe zur Weisheit, die wir Philosophie nennen. Das Thema dieses Kongresses: "Philosophie als Forschung und Lebensform" wird allen diesen Gründen, freudig gestimmt zu sein, sehr gut gerecht.

Die Reihe der Weltkongresse für Philosophie begann im Jahr 1900. Seither wurde in der Regel alle fünf Jahre ein Weltkongress abgehalten, wenngleich es mitunter kürzere Intervalle gab, und zwei größere, bedingt durch die beiden Weltkriege. So ist dies nun der dreiundzwanzigste Kongress. Ungeachtet der dunklen Wolken, die – ausgehend von ökonomischen Bedingungen – das gesamte Leben hier beeinträchtigt und so auch die Vorbereitungen für diesen Kongress überschattet haben, sind nun Teilnehmerinnen und Teilnehmer in so großer Zahl wie kaum je zuvor versammelt, die sich, wie ich hoffe, in den Strahlen jener „*έκυρος τοῦ ἀγαθοῦ*“, wie Platon's Sokrates es formulierte, sonnen werden – jener (Sommer-) Sonne, die dem Guten entspringt.

Das Beste an einem Weltkongress ist meiner Meinung nach, dass er Einblick in die ganze Welt des Denkens eröffnet, einschließlich der kulturell vielfältigen Perspektiven auf diese Welt, welche eine neue Realität und Lebendigkeit gewinnen, wenn sie in den Persönlichkeiten verkörpert sind, die hier aus aller Welt zusammenkommen. Man erwirbt einen Sinn für Gemeinschaft, der nicht reduzierbar ist auf die Art von Erfahrungen, die man auf einfachem touristischem Weg machen kann – obwohl auch dieser Aspekt für alle, die nach Athen reisen, seine Wichtigkeit hat. Man gewinnt, um es etwas abstrakt, aber, wie ich denke, dennoch treffend zu formulieren, einen Sinn für ein "globales Wir".

Sofern dies eine angemessene Darstellung der Atmosphäre ist, die wir während der Zeit dieses Kongresses teilen werden, gehört dazu auch, dass es uns gelingen sollte, die Philosophie nicht nur zur Erbauung, als etwas Innerliches, zu nutzen, sondern ihr Potential auch unseren Mitmenschen zu vermitteln, die durch sehr mächtige Kräfte in unserer zeitgenössischen Welt beständig dazu angeleitet werden, das Leben auf eine seichte, höchst oberflächliche Weise aufzufassen. Mögen also unsere Tage in Athen zu einem Glauben an das führen, was der Name einer alten akademischen Gesellschaft in meiner Heimat verkündet: "ἡ φιλοσοφία τοῦ βίου κυβερνήτης": Philosophie als Leitfaden des Lebens.

Mein herzlicher Dank gilt all jenen Personen, die in die harte Arbeit der Vorbereitung und Organisation dieses Weltkongresses involviert waren, und er gilt Ihnen allen für Ihre Teilnahme.

В мире, где, как часто говорится, к сожалению, так не хватает вежливости и взаимоуважения, этот Всемирный философский конгресс в Афинах должен явить пример обратного. По крайней мере, на это я надеюсь, присоединяясь к Константиносу Будурису и другим нашим коллегам и приветствуя всех участников конгресса и сопровождающих их партнеров, родственников и друзей. Общее настроение у нас должно быть праздничное: я имею в виду праздничные ощущения друг от друга, праздничные ощущения по поводу некоторых из наиболее выдающихся и плодотворных достижений в истории человеческой мысли и праздник любви к мудрости – того, что мы называем философией. Тема конгресса «Философия как познание и образ жизни» очень хорошо охватывает все эти праздничные поводы.

Современные всемирные конгрессы проводятся начиная с 1900-го года, раз в пять лет, иногда с более короткими интервалами и с двумя пропусками из-за мировых войн, так что этот конгресс – двадцать третий по счету. Хотя нельзя сказать, что при подготовке конгресса все прошло безоблачно (имеются в виду трудности прежде всего экономического характера, но затрагивающие также жизнь в целом), этот конгресс обещает собрать наибольшее число участников, которые, хочется надеяться, будут согреты лучами “*ἔκυοντο τοῦ ἀγαθοῦ*”, по выражению платоновского Сократа, лучами (летнего) солнца, плодами блага.

Наибольшее благо Всемирного философского конгресса, как мне кажется, – это окно, которое он открывает в целом мире мысли, включая различные культурные подходы к этому миру, которые обретают новую реальность, полную жизни, будучи воплощены в личностях настоящих философов, стекающихся со всех сторон земного шара. Возникает чувство общности, не сводимое к тому виду опыта, который предлагается обычным туризмом, хотя этот опыт и является важным элементом для всех, кто приезжает в Афины из других мест. Это чувство, говоря абстрактно, но, как мне кажется, выразительно, есть чувство «глобального понятия ‘мы’».

Что же касается того, что такова правильная оценка той атмосферы, в которой мы будем находиться в течение этого конгресса, – так вот, одно из следствий, вытекающих из этой оценки, состоит в том, что мы можем не только выиграть от философии как «утешения», как чего-то, направленного внутрь, но и ощутить ее внешнюю сторону, почувствовать, какую выгоду она может дать другим людям, тем, кому постоянно приходится под давлением могущественных сил, действующих в нашем современном мире, задумываться о жизни в ее наиболее мелких, поверхностных проявлениях. Пусть же это время в Афинах приведет, среди прочего, к воссозданию веры в то, что утверждает название одного старинного академического общества в моей стране, – веры в философию как “*ἡ φιλοσοφία τοῦ βίου κιβερνήτης*”, философию как наставницу жизни.

Я сердечно благодарю всех, кто помогал в трудной работе по подготовке и организации этого Всемирного конгресса, и каждого из вас за участие.

## Προς τους Συνέδρους του 23ου Παγκοσμίου Συνεδρίου Φιλοσοφίας

Σε ένα κόσμο στον οποίο, όπως συχνά λέγεται αυτές τις μέρες, η αίσθηση της αβρότητας και του αμοιβαίου σε-βασμού είναι απογοπτευτικά απούσα, το παρόν Παγκόσμιο Συνέδριο Φιλοσοφίας στην Αθήνα πρέπει να απο-τελεί ένα αντιπαράδειγμα. Αυτή είναι τουλάχιστον η ελπίδα μου καθώς εγώ μαζί με τον Κωνσταντίνο Βουδού-ρη και τους άλλους συναδέλφους μου καλωσορίζω όλους τους Συνέδρους μαζί με τα πρόσωπα που τους συ-νοδεύουν, τις οικογένειές τους και τους φίλους τους. Το γενικό κλίμα του Συνεδρίου πρέπει να είναι εορταστι-κό: για τις μεταξύ μας σχέσεις, για τον τόπο στον οποίο έγιναν ορισμένα από τα πιο σπουδαία επιτεύγματα στην ιστορία της ανθρώπινης διανόσης και εορταστικό για την αγάπη μας προς τη σοφία, προς ό,τι αποκαλούμε φι-λοσοφία. Το θέμα του Συνεδρίου «Η φιλοσοφία ως έρευνα και τρόπος ζωής» εμπερικλείει κατά σπουδαίο τρό-πο όλα αυτά τα εορταστικά στοιχεία.

Τα νεώτερα Παγκόσμια Συνέδρια Φιλοσοφίας γίνονται από το 1900 και εξής κάθε πέντε χρόνια με κάποια σύ-ντομα διαλείμματα και επίσης με δύο κενά που οφείλονται στους παγκόσμιους πολέμους, και έτσι το παρόν Συ-νέδριο είναι το *Εικοστό τρίτο*. Παρά τα μαύρα σύννεφα που κυρίως σχετίζονται με την οικονομική κατάσταση (αλλά που επηρεάζουν τη ζωή ως όλον) και που αιωρούνταν κατά την ετοιμασία του Συνεδρίου, το παρόν Συ-νέδριο είναι ένα από τα πιο πολυπλοκή συνέδρια σε σχέση με τα προηγούμενα και οι Σύνεδροι, όπως ευελπι-στώ, θα απολαύσουν στις ακτίνες εκείνου που είναι «*ἔκγονος τοῦ ἀγαθοῦ*», καθώς λέγει ο πλατωνικός Σω-κράτης, του (καλοκαιρινού) ήλιου, που είναι *το γέννημα του αγαθού*.

Το μέγιστο αγαθό ενός Παγκοσμίου Συνεδρίου Φιλοσοφίας είναι, όπως φαίνεται, το παράθυρο που αυτό ανοίγει σε όλη την ανθρώπινη σκέψη, περιλαμβανομένων των πολιτιστικά διαφορετικών προσεγγίσεων του κόσμου που συνιστούν μια νέα πραγματικότητα, μια πλήρη ζωή, όταν ενσαρκώνται στα πρόσωπα φυσικά των παρό-ντων φιλοσόφων που έρχονται από όλες τις γωνίες της Γης. Έτσι δημιουργείται ένα αίσθημα κοινότητας που δεν μπορεί να αναχθεί σε κάποια μορφή εμπειρίας που απλά παρέχει ο τουρισμός, ανεξάρτητα πόσο σπουδαίο είναι το τουριστικό στοιχείο για οποιονδήποτε που έρχεται στην πόλη των Αθηνών. Είναι για να εκφράσω το πράγμα κάπως αφορημένα αλλ' όμως νοηματικά, μια αίσθηση ενός οικουμενικού «εμείς».

Και εφ' όσον αυτό είναι μια σωστή αντίληψη για την ατμόσφαιρα που θα μοιρασθούμε κατά τις ημέρες του Συ-νεδρίου, μια υποδήλωση είναι ότι πρέπει επίσης να μπορέσουμε όχι μόνον να ωφεληθούμε από τη φιλοσοφία, νοούμενη ως *παραμυθία*, ως κάτι που έχει απήκηση μέσα μας, αλλ' επίσης ως κάτι που εκτείνεται προς τα έξω, προς τους συνανθρώπους μας, οι οποίοι σταθερά ωθούνται και πιέζονται από τις πολύ ισχυρές δυνάμεις του σύγχρονου κόσμου να σκέπτονται πολύ ρηχά για τη ζωή. Εύχομαι οι μέρες μας στην Αθήνα να έχουν ως απο-τέλεσμα, κοντά στα άλλα, στο να ανανεώσουμε την πίστη μας στη φιλοσοφία που είναι οδηγός του Βίου, «*ἡ φι-λοσοφία τοῦ βίου κυβερνήτης*», όπως δέχεται και η ακαδημαϊκή κοινότητα στη χώρα μου.

Οι εγκάρδιες ευχαριστίες μου σε όλους όσοι ενεπλάκησαν στη δύσκολη εργασία της προετοιμασίας και οργά-νωσης του Παγκοσμίου Συνεδρίου, και σε κάθε ένα ξεχωριστό από εσάς για τη συμμετοχή σας,
